Meeting called to order 6:00pm

Eversource electric bill for school house was given to the Historical Society.

Jeanne Eastman has decided that she would like to resign from the Supervisors of the Checklist.

The representative for the Selectmen to the Budget Committee will be Micah Voter.

Public Beach: The Selectmen will hold a hearing to discuss use of the town beach. They have the right to post the beach for residence only. They can also limit access to the boat launch to residence only. They also have the right to make parking rules. The biggest issue will be enforcement of the ordinance. Fish and Game said that they would continue to stock lower Kimball but will not police it. It was decided to hold the meeting on Thurs, Feb. 22 at 6:00. The meeting will be held at the town hall. There will be a notice put into the newspaper.

There has been a part ordered to fix the lock on the town office door. Mrs. Voter will be making a curtain to put up in the office to put in front of the safes. Wayne Infinger will be purchasing a larger mailbox. Sue Crowley will be washing and waxing the floor so that the office will be ready to use.

Kenyon King will be representing the town of Chatham at the Eastern Slope Airport. A letter is needed to verify this.

Road Agent:

There is a resident on Little Chatham Road that keeps calling to inform Alan of ice on the road. He told Alan that his son had been in an accident on the road and that a lawyer had told him that if he had notified the town ahead of time the town would be held liable for the accident. Wayne Infinger said that he would look into that and get back to Alan.

Doug MacPherson mentioned that the Historical Society would be hosting a final bon fire celebrating the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary for the town of Chatham. There would be a bon fire, slide show and food.
