Ron Briggs met with the Selectmen to discuss the proposed well easement between the town and the Historical Society. They discussed adding a water restriction of 750 gal/day. There was a question as to whether or not there would have to be meetings held prior to the Selectmen granting the easement. Wayne Infinger was fairly certain that there would not have to be but he was going to check with Peter Malia one more time just to be sure.

Timber Warrant for James Coogan was signed.

Contract with Rod Wood was signed.

Tax abatement was received from Tom Henriksen. It will be given to Rod Wood.

A letter was received from the town of Tamworth inquiring about recycling. This will be given to Jason Eastman.

The Selectmen received paperwork to check road changes/changes to officials of the town. This will be filled out after the town elections and returned.

DRA sent paperwork stating the town's median ratio and equalization numbers. The town has an 88.1 median ratio and 89 equalization. This will be shared with Rod Wood.

A letter will be sent to Mr. Derby explaining why his property is show to have only road frontage on the main roadway and not Robbins Hill Road.

Jen from the Department of Motor Vehicles sent the Selectmen information regarding preparing for the town to go on line to complete registrations.

The Selectmen met with Debbie Abraham and discussed a payment schedule for her to follow to purchase the property taken by tax deed. Ms. Abraham's agreed to pay 700 dollars per month until the amount of taxes owed has been paid in full.

Road Agent report:

It has been very busy. Dave McKenzie reported to Wayne Infinger that some of the shrubs that are along Little Chatham Road had been damaged.

Bill Briggs reported that there is a new Fire Chief in North Fryeburg. His name is Jeremy Kiley.

The Selectmen appointed Robert Farnham to continue to serve on the planning board.
