The Selectmen agreed that there was nothing that could be done at this point and instructed me to send a letter to them explaining that the amount sent to them is the amount that they requested and the amount can not be changed after the voters have approved the warrant article.

The Selectmen received a letter from Sandy Dorner expressing concerns over the care of the cemetery located next to her house. She is planning on having Colin Micklon clean up the trees that fell on her

Riley Pitman will meet with two electric companies to compare prices for setting up a generator at the town house. He will report back at the next meeting.

Steve Brown had approached the Selectmen about current use matters. He also had stopped in to the town clerk's office to ask about current use. He was directed to Rod Wood.


