Kimball Lake Shores update; Riley will check to make sure all trash was removed from the Johnson property.

The DOT report is due. The roads must be updated to reflect the change in the name of the Dewin Road in South Chatham.

The Elderly Exemption application is on hold until more information is gathered.

Bob Crowley will be notified that the bushes that were in the cemetery prior to the new guidelines are grandfathered and do not need to be removed.

Burt Weiss spoke with the Selectmen about signing an agreement and paying up to 10,000 dollars to join the Maine Broadband group. The Selectmen voted against signing the agreement at this time.

Riley Pitman brought up a concern that many people living in South Chatham have about the Stow portion of the road leading from North Fryeburg to South Chatham. The matter was discussed and a suggestion was made to contact the Fire department and the town of Stow. Riley will let the people know.
